



1.0 Background:

This year, the Global Fund's 7th Replenishment aims to raise at least 18 billion US\$ to fight HIV, TB and malaria and build stronger systems for health. It is estimated that one-third of the US\$18 billion – US \$6 billion – will be investments in resilient and sustainable systems for health that both support the ongoing fight against HIV, TB and malaria and reinforce pandemic preparedness. This has been witnessed during COVID-19: The same laboratories, supply chains, data systems, diagnostics tools, etc. built to fight HIV, TB and malaria were used to fight the new pandemic. The same community health workers who are vital to delivering HIV, TB and malaria services can simultaneously serve as the first line of defense to prevent, detect and respond to new disease outbreaks.

Here, it is important to note the role CSOs, Communities and Youth played during the 6th Replenishment of the Global Fund, which Leaders of donor Countries applauded during the pledge conference in Lyon, France. In the lead up to the 7th Replenishment, GFAN Africa in partnership with GFAN Asia-Pacific and GFAN Global are working on a joint advocacy for early and full Replenishment based on the Investment Case which was launched in March, 2022. In addition, GFAN Africa made a significant achievement during the “**Torch Caravan**” Campaign in celebration of the 20th Global Fund’s anniversary, where CSOs, Youth and Communities from 20 AU Member States from all Regions of the continent engaged with passion to amplify the success of the Global Fund by sharing their life experiences and their asks and expectations for the upcoming Replenishment. There was a broad range of engagement from the Ministries of Health, Members of Parliament, CSOs, CCM, Communities and Youth during the Torch Caravan.

In February 2022, the Torch was handed over to colleagues in the US, the host country of the 7th Replenishment in support and celebration of the impact made. In the lead up to the 7th replenishment conference, CSO across the continent will coordinate last mile advocacy efforts for a successful replenishment through a week of action that will be closed with a Torch Caravan event.

2.0 Objective of the Live show:

3.1 Format

3.2 Preparations

1. GFAN Africa to develop a promotional poster with host and profile pictures of guest speakers
2. Do a dry run on the Thursday preceding the Friday for the show at 1400 Hrs EAT
3. Live show on Monday Date 5th September 1400 Hrs EAT
4. Form a WhatsApp group for coordination

3.4 Checklist

5. The guest and the host should preferably have a laptop for the show. A smartphone should be used as a backup.
 6. The guest and host to have stable internet (preferably mobile data).
 7. During the live show- Every guest and host should ensure their devices are fully charged. They should also have a charger with them on standby.
 8. The guest and the host should be in place with good lighting.
 9. It's advisable for the guest and host to have earphones/headphones.
 10. Every guest and host should be in a place that is not noisy.
