

Country Brief on Global Fund Investments and Impact In the Republic of Senegal



The Republic of Senegal is both a donor and implementor for Global Fund-supported programs since 2003 during which significant progress has been made towards ending HIV, TB and Malaria

Overview

- The number of people living with HIV receiving antiretroviral treatment increased from 44% in 2015 to 77% in 2020.
- The number of people living with HIV who know their status increased from 56% in 2015 to 80% in 2020.
- The number of people living with HIV who have suppressed viral loads doubled between 2017 and 2020, from 33% to 65%.
- The TB treatment success rate increased from 86% in 2015 to 91% in 2019
- The total number of TB deaths decreased by 15% between 2015 and 2019.
- Between 2015 and 2019, malaria cases declined by 28% from 492,000 to 353,000.
- Between 2015 and 2019, malaria deaths declined by 50%.

7th Global Fund Replenishment at a Glance

20 years of Global Fund Partnership has saved 44 Million lives and this year the seventh replenishment will be the largest so far, with ambitious targets of getting back on track to end the epidemics while strengthening health systems to deal with future pandemics.

The 7th replenishment investment case shows the minimum required to get the world back on track toward ending HIV, TB and malaria. To do that we need to:
